1. How does Nahum describe the city of Nineveh in Nahum 3:1?

2. What imagery is used in Nahum 3:2-3 to describe the coming battle?

3. What reason is given for Nineveh's downfall in Nahum 3:4?

4. Reflection: Nahum announces judgement on a city once considered unshakeable in its power. What does that suggest about the limits of any nation's or institution's strength?

Nahum 3:1-4

¹Woe to the bloody city! it is all full of lies and robbery; the prey departeth not; ²The noise of a whip, and the noise of the rattling of the wheels, and of the prancing horses, and of the jumping chariots. ³The horseman lifteth up both the bright sword and the glittering spear: and there is a multitude of slain, and a great number of carcases; and there is none end of their corpses; they stumble upon their corpses: ⁴Because of the multitude of the whoredoms of the wellfavoured harlot, the mistress of witchcrafts, that selleth nations through her whoredoms, and families through her witchcrafts.
