1. What is Paul's attitude toward the Philippian church, according to Philippians 1:3-4?

2. What confidence does Paul express in Philippians 1:6?

3. What does Paul instruct believers to do instead of being anxious, in Philippians 4:6?

4. What does Paul say he has learned in Philippians 4:11-13, regardless of his circumstances?

5. Reflection: Paul wrote this letter from prison, yet it's full of joy. What does that suggest about where real joy comes from?

⁴Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice. ⁵Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand. ⁶Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. ⁷And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.
